

R.M. of Eldon No. 471  
Bylaw No. 114

A Bylaw to designate the property known as the Charlow (Shiloh) Baptist Church and Cemetery on Part of the North-East Quarter of Section Twelve, in Township Fifty, in Range Twenty-three, West of the Third Meridian, in the Province of Saskatchewan as being a site of historical value.

WHEREAS Part 111 of The Heritage Property Act authorizes the council of a municipality to enact bylaws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural, historical or natural value or interest; and

WHEREAS the Council of The Rural Municipality of Eldon No. 471 has caused to be served on the owners of the lands and premises known as the Charlow (Shiloh) Church and Cemetery a Notice of Intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such Notice of Intention to be published in at least two issues of a newspaper with general circulation in the municipality with the first publication at least twenty-one (21) days prior to the date of consideration of the bylaw and with the last publication at least seven (7) days prior to the date of that consideration; and

WHEREAS no Notice of Objection to the proposed designation has been served on the administrator of the municipality;

THEREFORE the Council of The Municipality of Eldon No. 471 enacts as follows:

1. There is designated as being of historical value the real property known as the Charlow (Shiloh) Baptist Church and Cemetery and legally described as:

All that portion of the North-East quarter of Section Twelve (12), in Township Fifty (50), Range Twenty-three (23), West of the Third Meridian, in the Province of Saskatchewan, in the Dominion of Canada, more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the South-Easterly angle of the said quarter Section; Thence West on the Southerly boundary of the said quarter Section, One hundred and forty (140) yards to a point; Thence Northerly parallel to the Eastern boundary of the said quarter Section Seventy (70) yards to a point; Thence Easterly parallel to the Southern boundary of the said quarter Section One hundred and forty (140) yards to a point; Thence Southerly on the Eastern boundary of said quarter Section Seventy (70) yards to the point of commencement, containing Two (2) acres, more or less,

Reserving to the Crown all Mines and minerals.


The significance of the site is as follows:

- a. The Charlow (Shiloh) Church was constructed in approximately 1912 and it was the Church used by the first Negro community in Saskatchewan.
- b. The Charlow (Shiloh) Cemetery is the only Negro cemetery in Saskatchewan.

2. The municipal administrator is hereby authorized to cause a certified copy of this bylaw to be registered against the property described above in the proper Land Titles Office.
3. The municipal administrator is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this bylaw to be served on the owner of the aforesaid property and on the Minister and to cause notice of the passing of this bylaw.
4. This bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the day of final passing thereof.
